Let's start with the <u>league</u> championship race. Going into the last game of the season, Sammy's Cafe (SC) with a 10-3 record was leading 2nd place Grayful Dead (GD) with a 9-4 record by one game and had defeated them earlier in the season by a score of 19-17.

Coincidentally, these two teams were about to go head-to-head in that game with 3 possible outcomes depending upon the results:

- (1) If SC wins/ties or if GD wins by less than 2 runs, then SC will be the champions
- (2) If GD wins by more than 2 runs, then GD will be the champions
- (3) If GD wins by <u>exactly 2 runs</u>, then a one-game playoff between SC and GD will be played to determine the champions. The league championship was decided in top of the 7th/open inning when Sammy's Cafe scored 2 runs only to lose the game by 1 run 14-13, but win the <u>league</u> championship by virtue of the "runs allowed" tiebreaker (see outcome (1) above).

Now let's go to the post-season 8-team single-elimination <u>tournament</u> where 2 teams and several pickups played 3 games in 100+ heat. Eric Morrison and Jim Roach played 4. In the championship game between #1 seed Sammy's Cafe and #3 seed Ed Rushing's Blue Bolts, it was 104 degrees at BLD/Perris when the first pitch was delivered and 106 degrees when the final out recorded. After 6 innings, with Blue Bolts leading 12-9, Sammy's Cafe held their opponent scoreless in the top of the 7th/open inning. But Blue Bolts, on a game-ending double play in the bottom of the inning, returned the favor to win the <u>tournament</u> championship. Congratulations to both teams!

MVUDSS league games are played on Monday mornings at the Big League Dreams Sports Park in Perris. The league offers tournament-caliber senior softball players 55 and older an opportunity to participate in a highly competitive, well-balanced, tournament-style league. Players turning 55 in calendar year 2019 are eligible to play in the upcoming Fall 2018 Season.

The league consists of players and teams from the Temecula Valley, Riverside, Ontario, and North San Diego County areas. Traveling teams have the option of playing once a week or playing bi-weekly doubleheaders.

League President Steve Baranick said, "Our league consists of six local teams and two out-of-area teams from North San Diego County and Ontario and continues to attract new players from around Southern California."
